## OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS: Oregon's private, nonprofit, independent colleges and universities are vital to Oregon's goal

for a more educated and skilled workforce, enriching local communities, and contributing to

our state's education attainment goals, educating approximately 34,000 students and

conferring nearly 10,500 undergraduate degrees annually; and

**WHEREAS:** Oregon's private, nonprofit, independent colleges support immediate and long-term

economic development, producing qualified and skilled graduates in key employment sectors, such as education (66 percent), health professions (53 percent), business and marketing (24 percent), and public administration and social services (20 percent), with 62

percent of undergraduate students finishing their degrees in four years; and

**WHEREAS:** Oregon's private, nonprofit colleges support education attainment for a socially, racially, and

economically diverse population, with one in five undergraduates the first in their families to attend college, 32 percent self-identifying as persons of color, 28 percent eligible for federal

Pell Grants, and the highest graduation rate in Oregon among students of color; and

**WHEREAS:** Oregon private colleges contribute \$3.2 billion annually to the state's economy, employing

8,547 faculty and staff, supporting local economies, and enriching the quality of life in their

home communities.
